GREENE'S TUCTORIA (TUCTORIA GREENEI)

Federal/California status: Endangered/Rare California Native Plant Society List 1B



Description

Greene's tuctoria is an annual member of the grass family (Poaceae). It grows 2 to 6 inches (5 to 15 cm) tall and is pale green, hairy, and tufted. The plant develops several

to many erect stems. Flowers bloom from May to September.

Habitat

It grows in the dried bottoms of vernal pools in the central valley. It may be found with Hoover's spurge (Chamaesyce hooveri), hairy Orcutt grass (Orcuttia pilosa) and Boggs Lake hedge-hyssop (Gratiola heterosepala).

Range/distribution

Within the project area, it occurs in Butte, Glenn, Merced, and Tehama counties, over a range of 258 miles (415 km). It may also occur in Fresno, Madera, San Joaquin, and Stanislaus counties.
